What is certification and why is it important?

Certification is a formal process which validates, based on predetermined standards, an individual's qualifications and knowledge to practice in a defined area. The NAFC certification programs are designed to establish the body of knowledge, experience and education that promotes effective delivery of counseling, evaluation, examination, supervision and forensic services to clients, attorneys and the civil/criminal justice system.

Certification creates an identifiable workforce from which the criminal justice system can refer and offers the opportunity to gain recognition from other professionals, court systems, probation/parole departments, corrections, law enforcement and the public for your achievement as a knowledgeable, competent professional in the field of forensic counseling, evaluation, supervision, etc.

Certification can mean a broader range of job opportunities, provide job mobility, and marketability of your skills. Many companies, agencies, courts, etc., may even pay for your certification, training, and renewal fees.

Apply for Certification through Test-exempt Grandfathering for a Limited Time Period. If you apply during the Grandfathering period, you will not be required to sit for the certification examination.

Certification application must be completed in its entirety, to include all requested information, in order to be processed.

Certified Human Trafficking Victim Services Provider (CHTVSP) (Clinical level only)

For professionals providing psychological services, mental health and/or addictions counseling, crisis intervention, trauma services or other area of service to victims of human trafficking.

Requirements for the CHTVSP:

- Masters degree or higher;
- State licensed, active and in good standing, in your profession, i.e., psychology, social work, marriage & family therapy, mental health counselor, professional counselor, addictions, etc., unless special exemption applies, i.e., through legislation/regulations, you are a state or federal employee, no licensure exists in your state of practice, etc.;
- A combined total of 270 hours formal training in victim services, evaluation/assessment, trauma counseling, crisis intervention, addictions, PTSD, and ethics
- Minimum of 3 years (or 6000 hrs) of supervised experience working with human trafficking victims
- No ethical violations, reprimands, or other sanctions against your state license and/or certification;
- Must not have previously held an NAFC certification that has been suspended or revoked;
- No misdemeanor or felony arrests for violent or sexual offenses, or any other felony;

Certified Sexual Disorders Diagnostician (CSDD) (Clinical level only)

For professionals performing evaluations/assessments and diagnosis of persons with sexual disorders.

Requirements CSDD (this certification is clinical level only):

- Masters degree or higher;
- State licensed, active and in good standing, in your profession, i.e., psychology, social work, marriage & family therapy, mental health counselor, professional counselor, addictions, etc., unless special exemption applies, i.e., through legislation/regulations, you are a state or federal employee, no licensure exists in your state of practice, etc.;
- 50 hours of formal training in evaluating/assessing and diagnosing sexual disorders;
- 220 hours of formal training in sexual disorders;
- Minimum of 3 years (or 6000 hrs) of supervised experience evaluating/assessing, diagnosing, and treating sexually disordered offenders.
- No ethical violations, reprimands, or other sanctions against your state license and/or certification;
- Must not have previously held an NAFC certification that has been suspended or revoked;
- No misdemeanor or felony arrests for violent or sexual offenses, or any other felony;

Certified Sexual Addictions Specialist (CSAS)* (clinical, non-clinical, and In-Service available)

For professionals working with offenders diagnosed with a sexual addiction.

Requirements for CSAS (non-clinical):

- Bachelors degre
- 180 hours of formal training in evaluating/assessing, diagnosing, and/or treating offenders diagnosed with a sexual addiction
- Minimum of 2 years (or 4000 hrs) of supervised experience working with offenders diagnosed with a sexual addiction

Requirements for CCSAS (Clinical level):

- Masters degree or higher
- 270 hours of formal training in evaluating/assessing, diagnosing, and/or treating offenders diagnosed with a sexual addiction
- Minimum of 3 years (or 6000 hrs) of supervised experience working with offenders diagnosed with a sexual disorder

Additional Requirements for both CSAS and CCSAS:

- State licensed, active and in good standing, in your profession, i.e., psychology, social work, marriage & family therapy, mental health counselor, professional counselor, addictions, etc., unless special exemption applies, i.e., through legislation/regulations, you are a state or federal employee, no licensure exists in your state of practice, etc.(All levels);

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- No misdemeanor or felony arrests for violent or sexual offenses, or any other felony;
- No ethical violations, reprimands, or other sanctions against your state license and/or certification;
- Must not have previously held an NAFC certification that has been suspended or revoked;

^{*} applicants that do not fully meet all requirements may apply for the "In-Service" designation of the non-clinical level until such time when verifiable proof of meeting all requirments is submitted to the NAFC.
